CORRECTIONS

- Lot 1004 Please note the correct description as follows:
Sèvres Porcelain (Later-Decorated) Gilt Trellis Pink-Ground Plate (Assiette Unie)
The porcelain late 18th century, blue interlaced L's mark and script painter's mark for de Laroche, incised potter's mark F with serifs, the 19th century ground color and gilt decoration perhaps by Edward Holmes Baldock
The center finely painted with a tight bouquet, the border with four cartouches enclosing birds, the pink border enriched with ombriert gilt trellis. Diameter 9 1/2 inches (24 cm).
- Lot 1007 This lot is sold with its saucer, which is not illustrated in the catalog.
- Lot 1011 Please note the correct description as follows:
Sèvres Porcelain (Later-Decorated) Pink-Ground and Gilt Caillouté Plate (Assiette à Palmes)
The porcelain circa 1756, blue interlaced L's enclosing the date letter C, the painter's mark of three dots for Charles Tandart, the ground color and gilt decoration later
The central landscape vignette painted with two birds, the gilt caillouté ground interrupted by three reserves of flowers within gilt foliate surrounds. Diameter 9 3/4 inches (24.8 cm).
- Lot 1012 Please note the correct description as follows:
Sèvres Porcelain (Later-Decorated) Pink-Ground Cylindrical Teapot and Cover (Théière Litron)
The porcelain 18th century, spurious blue interlaced L's mark, incised 5 and 10, the decoration 19th century
Of tapering cylindrical form with straight spout and ear-shaped handle, the flat cover with spire finial, each side painted with a bird strutting in a landscape within a seeded gilt cartouche outlined in carmine. Height 4 3/4 inches (12 cm).
- Lot 1018 This lot is sold with its saucer, which is not illustrated in the catalog.

- Lot 1028 Please note the correct description as follows:
Two Sèvres Porcelain (Later-Decorated) Turquoise Ribbon Decorated Shaped Square Dessert Dishes (Compotier Carré)
The porcelain circa 1768, blue interlaced L's enclosing the date letter P, painter's mark nq for Nicquet and potter's incised marks, the ribbon and gilt decoration 19th century
Each painted with a central bouquet and floral garland, the peripheral looped ribbon and gilt oil-de-perdrix decoration added later, gilt dentil rims. 8 1/2 inches (20.6 cm), square.
- Lot 1029 Please note the correct description as follows:
Sèvres Porcelain (Later-Decorated) Turquoise-Ground Lozenge-Shaped Tray (Plateau Losange)
The porcelain 18th century, spurious blue interlaced L's mark and painter's mark B., incised potter's J.
The center painted with a pastoral couple in a garden vignette, the border with four floral reserves within gilt foliate surrounds. Width 10 inches (25.4 cm).
- Lot 1047 Please note the correct description as follows:
Vincennes or Early Sèvres Porcelain Bleu Céleste Ground Coffee-Can and Saucer (Gobelet Litron et sa Soucoupe)
Circa 1758, blue interlaced L's enclosing two dots at each intersection, the cup with a faint painter's mark N possibly for Aloncle, the saucer incised 41
Painted with flowers within a gilt floral trellis surround, gilt dentil rims. Height of cup 3 inches. Together with Two Sèvres Style Louis Philippe Monogrammed Coffee-Cups and Saucers, Late 19th century, spurious marks and a Sèvres (Later-Decorated) Milk-Jug, the porcelain 18th century, the decoration later
- François Joseph Aloncle was recorded as a painter of birds, animals and emblems at Sèvres active 1758-1781.
- Provenance:
The coffee-can and saucer: with The Antique Porcelain Company, Inc., New York, (label). The monogrammed cups and saucers: with Maison Popoff, Paris (labels).
- Lot 1207 Please note, this chair is 19th century and George III STYLE, not 18th century.
- Lot 1252 Please note the correct description as follows:
Regency Black Lacquer Chinoiserie Decorated Linen Press, Circa 1810
The upper section with a pair of doors opening to an arrangement of drawers, the lower section opening to divided slide out shelves. The upper left drawer bearing the inscription 'This cabinet is the gift of Mrs. Robinson to her two daughters Jane and Mary Robinson. Thorp Green. Dec. 25th, 1808. Height 6 feet 9 1/4 inches (206.5 cm), width 47 3/4 inches (118.6 cm), depth 22 1/4 inches (55.6 cm).

Lot 1297 Please note the correct description as follows:
Assembled Set of Eight William IV Mahogany Dining Chairs
Six Second quarter 19th century, two of a later date Comprising two armchairs and six
side chairs. Height 38 inches (96.5cm), width 22 inches (55.9cm), depth 22 inches
(55.9cm).
